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Teachers were reminded of the fun and 'sport for a lifetime' nature of tenpin bowling and whilst many teachers admitted to enjoying tenpin with their students – some hadn't realised it's included in the Australian Sports Commissions' Sporting School initiative.

As part of Sporting Schools, teachers can access funding to run a tenpin program either within their school or at a centre nearby. Utilising either teachers within the school or tapping in to the network of tenpin coaches across the country.

Whilst this offer is only available in primary schools at this stage, both sectors expressed keen interest in the portable lanes kits.
